



Questions for the Rector



What is the difference between the Anglican Church and the Episcopal Church?

Most Anglican churches and the Episcopal church in America are both members of the worldwide Anglican communion- made up primarily but not exclusively of churches founded by British missionaries as they followed the development of the British Empire. We share roots in the Book of Common Prayer, though each jurisdiction has developed their own version. We also all have bishops and sacraments.

The situation is different here in the US. In our country, if a church calls itself Anglican that generally means that they have separated themselves from the Episcopal Church, usually over issues of women's or gay/lesbian ordination or changes to the prayerbook. There are some Anglican dioceses in the US and they affiliated primarily with dioceses in Africa. The US Anglican dioceses are not part of the Anglican Communion, as we are. There is a dissenting group of dioceses worldwide who maintain membership in the Anglican Communion but are also members of a group called Gafcon, which meets separately from the Lambeth Conference (where Anglican Communion bishops gather every 10 years or so.) It all gets a little confusing but generally, outside the US, Anglicans and Episcopalians belong to sister churches. Inside the US, Anglican and Episcopal churches are not related and generally disagree on some major issues.
