Questions for the Rector



Years ago, we were instructed that we should not eat before the Eucharist. When did that change and why?

The decision whether or not to eat before communion is rooted in what we believe the nature of communion to be. In the Roman Catholic Church, which maintains the "no eating before communion" rule, the communion elements are understood to be literally

Christ's Body and Blood and so it is appropriate to respect them by having them be the first thing one eats in the morning or the only thing in one's stomach if the communion is received later in the day. In churches such as the Methodist and Presbyterian, communion is understood to be a symbolic reminder of Christ's sacrifice for us, and while important, not holy in and of itself. We Episcopalians split the difference. We believe that the bread and wine of communion are made the Body and Blood of Christ FOR US. We do not believe that the bread and wine are changed at a molecular level, but we do believe that they are really changed, and through our prayers and Christ's promise, become holy for us. That means we treat the consecrated elements with respect- we receive and consume them respectfully and we do not throw the remains in the trash or down the drain.

I think the change in "no eating before communion" came primarily after the 1976 revision of the Book of Common Prayer. In that revision, we changed our primary worship from Morning Prayer to Holy Eucharist. In doing so, we started to have a "lower church," less formal and ritualized understanding of communion. That is also the time that we began to allow all the baptized to receive communion (including children), not just those who had been confirmed. Whether or not to eat before receiving communion is a personal choice. If it feels more respectful to come to communion fasting, then that's what you should do. There is no requirement one way or the other.

What does the Stewardship Committee do?

It is the mission of the stewardship Committee to encourage every member of the church to become or to continue to be good stewards of our church by giving their time, talent or treasure (or all three) to make sure that St. David's remains a strong, active, warm and welcoming church.
