



Sacred Ground is an online reading and video discussion series on race, grounded in faith.

This is a 10 session series that St David's will begin on Tuesday, November 10 from 6:30-8pm. Our second meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday December 8 from 6:30-8pm. The discussions in this series will be held, at least initially on Zoom. The rest of the curriculum is offered free from the National Church.


